Our Customers Summit City Fitness Center Owners are Honored for Saving Life

Mike Kirkhoff doesn't remember what happened New Year's Day, but he knows it could have ended a lot worse.

The 50-year-old suffered sudden cardiac arrest after completing his morning workout at Summit City Fitness on Trier Road. An ambulance was called at 11:59 a.m. and arrived just three minutes later.

But what really helped keep Kirkhoff alive was the fitness center owners' effort to revive him. David and Susan Peters, owners of the center, performed CPR on Kirkhoff and used an automatic external defibrillator they purchased for such an emergency.

"Basically, I owe them my life," Kirk-hoff said. "If that would have happened in my car, I wouldn't be standing here."

Mayor Tom Henry on Monday presented the Peters' with a framed certificate honoring them for their efforts in saving a life. Henry has advocated that residents learn basic CPR and said the city will have another event this spring for people to get basic training.

"Emergency preparedness is a valuable tool for everyone," he said. Gary

Booher, Three Rivers Ambulance Authority executive director, joined the mayor in encouraging residents to learn the lifesaving skill. Kirkhoff said he returned to normal activities, including trips to the gym, just weeks after the cardiac arrest.
